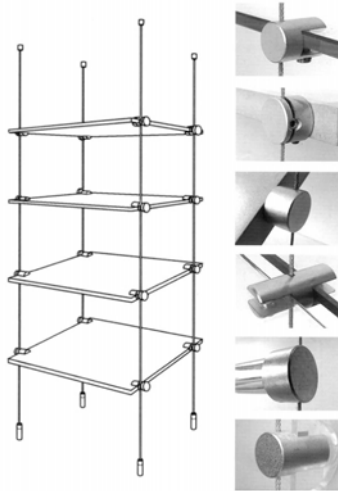


## Sophisticated Product:

## Thinking far enough ahead?

A recent documentary left me shocked at the extent of toxic waste dumping by large companies.

For our part Display Tactix has been recycling for several years. A lot of plastic off-cuts are passed on to students; we also send off around half a tonne of scrap plastic for recycling each month and each week we generate a bin of waste paper and card for recycling.

While recycling in New Zealand is in its infancy, there is a good infrastructure in place. Recycling costs are minimal; it just takes a little planning and often lateral thinking to set up!
